You will experience what it means to be an engaged, effective democratic citizen.



Evening

Relax with new friends, watch and talk about thought provoking films that focus on your service work, or participate in any number of enrichment and social activities back on campus or in the city—perhaps the local minor league baseball park or Sun National Bank Center. In addition, TCNJ admissions counselors will lead a session to help you learn how to highlight your service experiences during the college application process.
